Helping Your Child Make Progress



How Often Is Homework Set?

Homework will start on the 18th September. Until Christmas, Year 7 pupils will get less homework than normal to help them with the transition to high school.

HALF-TERM 1

Pupils will receive **one** of English, Maths or Science for the 3 weeks from 18th September. For the 2 weeks beginning 9th October, they will receive **two** of English, Maths or Science.

HALF-TERM 2

Pupils will receive four homeworks per week – one for each of English, Maths, Science and Spanish.

HALF-TERM 3 onwards

From half-term 3 onwards, pupils will follow the normal Year 7 and 8 homework system:

Weekly homework in 4 subjects: English, Mathematics, Science and Spanish.

Homework Every 3 Weeks: some subjects will set homework once every 3 weeks: History, Geography, Art, Music, Dance, Drama, Food or Graphics and ICT/Computing.

PE Homework: this is a practical homework. Students must go to one after-school PE session per Learning Block.

There are separate leaflets for each half-term to set out which homework they will get on a particular week. These are available from the school office, can be found in the parents' rooms or by emailing Mrs Hopwood (Deputy Headteacher) at

What Kind Of Homework Will It Be?

Homework can be:

a) Set on paper and returned on paper;

b) Set online through our homework

Homework Clubs

Helping With Homework

You Can Make A Big Difference To Your Child!

- Ask your child what homework they have each day.
- Sit with them and help them complete it.
- Take an interest in the homework projects that are set for your child.
- Help them to set aside a regular time each day to complete their homework.
- Make sure that they have pens, pencils, paper whatever they need to complete the work. If there are issues with being able to provide these, contact us at school we will be happy to help.
- If the homework has been set on Doddle, you can check that it has been done by using your child's login.
- You can view all homework set for your child on Google Classroom.

What Happens If They Can't Complete Their Homework?

This can happen for a number of reasons. If it is a one-off reason, for example a weekly homework can't be completed because there is a family emergency, please send your child with a note to the class teacher, or telephone school to let us know. If they can't complete it because they don't understand it, your child needs to see the class teacher before the homework is due so that the teacher can help them with it. If there are any other issues particular to your child, please telephone us at school and let us know. We are here to help and support you and your child.

Homework Detentions

Homework is a crucial part of learning and making progress. If a child does not complete their homework without a good reason, they might be given extra time by the teacher and if it is not done then, they will have a detention with their class teacher. If they do not complete 3 homeworks in a 4 week timescale, they will go into an after-school detention for **one hour**. If this happens more than once, the detention will be for 1 ½ hours.





Homework Does Matter!

Research from Duke University (one of the top universities in the U.S.) shows that homework has a positive effect on how well your child does at school.

They reviewed more than 60 research studies on homework and found that it had a positive impact on student achievement. This impact was particularly large for secondary students.
